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

GTA Phase 1 progress

Thanks to the commitment and dedication of our people, GTA Phase 1 continues to make good progress towards delivering individual scopes and integrating this global project offshore Mauritania and Senegal. Here is the latest news from the project delivery lines...

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Subsea

Installation activities continue offshore Mauritania and Senegal. The installation vessel is operating in the GTA field to lay the deepwater sections of the two production flowlines from the wellheads in 2850m water depth to the floating production, storage, and offloading (FPSO) vessel. Once moored in its final location, the FPSO will sit in ~150m water depth.



FLNG

Commissioning of the floating liquefied natural gas (FLNG) equipment packages continues to make good progress in Singapore. A critical milestone was achieved in May 2023 with the start of dynamic commissioning of the first steam turbine generator, which will provide power when the vessel is installed at its final location at the Hub. Our team at the shipyard in Singapore, as well as at the FPSO, were excited to recently host delegations of Mauritanian and Senegalese officials, enabling officials from both countries to see progress on the ground for themselves. FPSO

The FPSO has now completed its pit-stop in Singapore, where the team needed to conclude some additional installation scope. It is now progressively continuing the journey to its final offshore location where the in-country teams have been preparing for its arrival. The vessel will have sailed 12,000 nautical miles in total before it will be moored in place and commissioning can commence.

Hub

Work is progressing well towards enabling the handover of the management of the Hub The distance the FPSO will travel to the Hub

from the projects team to the operations team. Scaffolding has started to be dismantled and the first system handover has been achieved, a great success for the offshore teams. Over 70 people have transferred from the flotel, a vessel moored at the Hub providing temporary accommodation during construction, to start living onboard the Hub guarters and utilities (QU) facility. In June 2023, the flotel successfully departed, marking the start of a new offshore phase. This, together with the first helicopter flight safely received at the QU, displays significant strides forward.

Greater Tortue Ahmeyim (GTA) project



Spotlight on FPSO sailaway

A major project milestone was achieved earlier this year on 20 January 2023 when, following the successful completion of a series of sea trials, the GTA Phase 1 FPSO safely set sail from the shipyard in Qidong, China.



Its onwards journey, totalling 12,000 nautical miles, will see the state-of-the-art vessel towed to its final destination at the GTA development, situated 40km offshore on the maritime border of Mauritania and Senegal. Upon arrival the vessel will be moored in ~150m deep water, attached to the seabed via 16 pre-installed mooring chains, each 380m long and weighing a total of more than 6,000 tonnes. The sailaway was a fantastic achievement for the project. Delivered through a challenging environment, including the COVID-19 pandemic, the team managed to keep safe operations

The FPSO will process 500 million standard cubic feet of natural gas per day at the core of everything they have done.

The FPSO is a key part of the GTA gas development, responsible for processing 500 million standard cubic feet of natural gas per day, before transferring it by pipeline to the FLNG facilities 10km offshore. This project is a great example of resilient hydrocarbons in bp's strategy and is expected to have a lasting and positive impact for generations to come.

Spotlight on first helicopter landing at the Hub

April 2023 saw an important transition take place with the landing of the first helicopter flight on the helideck of the QU facility, located in Senegalese waters at the GTA Hub.

This achievement took a lot of work behind the scenes, collaborating with Senegal's civil aviation authority (ANACIM) to undertake the necessary helideck inspections and get the required certification in place.

This great work culminated with the arrival of the first helicopter crew change flight on 24 April 2023; with nine passengers onboard from ANACIM and bp.

This marks a big change for the team working on the Hub as it transitions from a journey that took roughly six hours by sea, with the risk of bad weather, to a 45-minute journey in relative comfort. Although not everyone is yet crew changing via helicopter, following this approval six flights per week were running from June with an intent to move up to 16 flights per week in the

near future. This is a great step forward for the team and shows the progress bp and partners are making to starting-up an operational facility.

This process will be repeated with Mauritania's National Agency of Civil Aviation, when the FPSO arrives to Mauritanian waters later in 2023.

bp sponsors the 20th International Exhibition of Energy and Petroleum in Africa (SIEPA)

This year, the SIEPA was held at the King Fahd Hotel in Dakar on 7 and 8 March 2023. The event was organised by the Association for the Development of Energy in Africa and the Senegalese Associated for the Development of Energy in Africa.

SIEPA is an opportunity for stakeholders to exchange views on oil and gas production prospects, on local content in the oil and gas industry and hydrocarbon governance. It is also an opportunity to discuss issues relating to training, access to finance, the development of renevvable energy generation capacity and developments in electricity markets. The wideranging debates attracted considerable public interest.

Professionals from the oil, gas, electricity and renewable energy industries, energy sector stakeholders and the Senegalese government and administrations were brought together to discuss the future of the energy sector in Africa. bp's project support manager in Senegal, Abdoulaye Niang, provided the audience with an update on the GTA project and its various components. He also gave an overview of the development of bp's comprehensive social investment programme in country, aimed at improving the quality of life of the local communities in region.

bp and partners announce GTA Phase 2

On Friday 24 February 2023 bp and partners confirmed the development concept for the second phase of the GTA liquefied natural gas (LNG) development, that will now be taken forward to the next stage of evaluation.

The partnership, comprised of bp, PETROSEN, Société Mauritanienne des Hydrocarbures (SMH) and Kosmos Energy, agreed a concept that expands on existing GTA infrastructure, includes new wells and subsea equipment, but will also evaluate a gravity-based "We aim to build on our strong collaboration with our partners, and the governments of Mauritania and Senegal, to further develop a long-term, successful energy hub in West Africa. GTA continues to underpin our strategy to develop the most resilient hydrocarbons to help provide energy security today".

Gordon Birrell, bp's executive vice president for production and operations structure (GBS) as the basis for the GTA Phase 2 expansion project. The additional LNG production is estimated between 2.5-3.0 million tonnes per annum.

GBS LNG developments have a large tank sitting on the seabed with the structure providing LNG storage and a foundation for liquefication facilities.

From 9-14 March 2023, representatives from the Ministry of Petroleum and Energies of Senegal, led by the Director of Hydrocarbons, Papa Samba Ba, visited the FPSO and FLNG sites. Between 17-18 April 2023, delegates from SMH, including the Director General Tourad Abdel Baghi and his colleagues were welcomed on the facilities.

At the FPSO, both parties were hosted by Graeme Chapman, bp's project general manger for hookup and commissioning, and the projects team. This included a tour of the facilities and project update

presentation, which was well received by the invited guests.

bp also hosted an FLNG visit at the Keppel yard. While the construction was ongoing, the delegation had opportunity to visit the vessel, familiarize themselves with the GTA assets and received a project update presentation. These visits provided the Mauritanian and Senegalese representatives an opportunity to capture the scale of the project's assets and put any questions they had about the FPSO and FLNG to the site team. It was informative, enlightening, and further cemented relationships between bp and its key stakeholders.

bp participates in the fourth roundtable on mineral resources governance in Senegal

The Observatory for Monitoring Economic Development Indicators in Africa (OSIDEA) is a non-profit organisation that promotes the evaluation of public policy governance and electoral processes. OSIDEA annually organises a roundtable event to discuss mineral resources governance in Senegal with its key partners, namely the Ministry of Oil and Energy, bp, Woodside and Société Pétrolière du Sénégal (PETROSEN).

The roundtable brings together numerous stakeholders such as the state, civil society, public institutions, the private sector and oil and gas operators in Senegal. bp participated in the fourth edition of this event, held in Dakar on 10 January 2023, under the theme 'Strategies to build bridges of the energy transition around oil and gas'.

bp has been a partner of OSIDEA since its launch. This round table, which over the years has become an essential platform for exchanges on the challenges of hydrocarbon exploitation, offered participants a better understanding of the prospects

for socio-economic development

from a national, sub-regional and international perspective. The Minister of Petroleum and Energy, Her Excellency Aissatou Sophie Gladima gave the opening remarks of this edition.

The roundtable was also an opportunity for bp's vice-president and head of country Senegal, Massaer Cisse, to share an update on GTA's progress, including project activities that are having a positive impact on our communities and stimulating socio-economic opportunities for our stakeholders in Mauritania and Senegal.

These visits help show bp's focus and commitment to safety and security issues in the work zone, strengthen relationships and were an excellent opportunity to show the progress and hard work to date and create anticipation for what's still to come.

Labour rights workshops in Mauritania and Senegal

The day was filled with informative sessions led by bp's people and culture team and leaders in the field of labour rights. Attendees had the opportunity to gain new insights

Workshop with local artisanal fishing council of Saint-Louis

In May 2023, bp participated in a consultation workshop with the Saint-Louis artisanal fishing community, organized by the local artisanal fishing council of Saint-Louis which represents a significant number of fishing associations across the region.

A key objective was to reinforce the collaboration between bp, partners and the local fishing community as stakeholders strive for sustainable fishing practices alongside gas extraction. These consultations also provided an opportunity to discuss cohabitation at sea and safety within the GTA work zone.

The meeting was chaired by the Saint-Louis Prefect and saw the presence of notable figures from Guet-Ndar, a key fishing community in Saint-Louis, and our partners Kosmos and PETROSEN. bp's team led by external affairs manager for Senegal, Fatimata Sow, participated in the meeting

Throughout the workshops, participants engaged in interactive group activities and discussions, which helped them to connect

By participating in these consultations and key discussions, bp is better able to engage with local communities to mitigate risks and contribute to with one another and share their own perspectives and ideas.

By the end of each day, attendees had developed a deeper understanding of labour rights and learned strategies for implementing them within their businesses to meet their legal, social, and contractual obligations.

The ninth Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative (EITI) conference was hosted for the first time on the African continent in Dakar, Senegal and took place from 13-15 June 2023.

EITI is a multi-stakeholder organisation, whose goal is to promote transparency and good governance of oil, gas, and mineral resources. Senegal has been a partner since 2013. This year's flagship conference marks their 20th anniversary and brought together over 1,000 stakeholders from around the world to reflect on the management of natural resource transparency and to set future priorities for EITI implementation.

Honoured guests included His Excellency Amadou Ba, Prime Minister of Senegal who delivered the opening remarks and His Excellency the Prime Minister



of Mauritania, Mohammed Bilal Messoud who received the 2023 EITI Chair Award for Mauritania.

Also present was Emil Ismayilov and bp's Ivanka Mamic, senior vice president sustainability. Along with the global conference, the EITI announced its new board, where Ivanka was nominated to represent bp. The board consists of a tri-partisan group of stakeholders from EITI implementing and supporting governments, civic society, and companies.

The Senegalese government successfully hosted this first global conference in Africa and it is with pleasure that bp shall continue to play an integral role in supporting Senegal's energy transition goals.


very rewarding to create value by ensuring that both countries benefit from the revenues of our operations.

How do you encourage local companies to participate in the supply chain and how can they get involved with bp?

Our team, together with a range of internal stakeholders, has developed innovative ways to integrate local companies in the supply chain. For example, we periodically hold supplier engagement sessions to explain the sourcing process to the local market as it can be quite protracted. We also encourage both local and international companies to seek partnerships with each other through consortia or joint ventures to deliver the scope. We also strongly encourage international companies to develop meaningful local content plans. Lastly, we also sometimes segregate contracts into smaller scopes of work to optimize opportunities for local companies to participate in the tendering process.

The bp supplier portal is an excellent online resource for finding upcoming opportunities as a supplier. The portal provides information about our upcoming tendering activities and allows suppliers to register their interest for working with bp. On the portal you can also learn more on bp's procurement processes, as well as the standards required to deliver services to a world class energy project like GTA.

Apprentice technicians' global deployment

As of June 2023, the majority of our apprentice technicians have departed from technical college in Scotland and have arrived at their global assignment locations.

This phase of their multi-year training programme will see them undertaking assignmentbased technical training, helping transform them from apprentice technicians, into fully fledged

operators. Training is rigorously assessed via evidence-based tasks, with competence measured against the internationally recognized Scottish Vocation Qualification (SVQ). Upon successful completion of the programme, they will gain an SVQ3 from Forth Valley college in Scotland, where they began their technician journey. Operating regions providing on the job training are Trinidad and Tobago, Azerbaijan, Oman and Indonesia. We spoke to field technician Papa Ndiaga Ndoye from Senegal, who is currently based both offshore and onshore in Trinidad and Tobago. Papa had these motivational words for future bp joiners, "working with bp requires a lot of commitment to safety, because that's what matters. You will find great pleasure to work with bp."

Field technician Khadjietou 'Tata' Cheikh Mohamed Vade, from Mauritania, is currently based in Azerbaijan. She commented that what excites her about her new role is she can now "know how things really work" and "can "discover the work environment in a real offshore platform." Tata went on to say, "as I progress

Update from the National Institute for Oil and Gas (INPG)



The INPG in Dakar is a national institute that plays a key role in the

development of Senegal's energy sector. bp has been supporting the INPG since 2018; last year in 2022, bp signed a memorandum of understanding to continue our support for another 4 years. bp has already supported scholarships and internships and continues to provide financial aid to the institute.



The third cohort of INPG students specializing in the oil and gas industry, kick started a Masters in Oil and Gas Engineering course in October 2022. The students continued their theoretical training at the centre until the end of June



2023. After taking a short break, their practical hands-on training should begin in September 2023 in an international location.

The former cohort of 2021-2022 have been hired at companies such as ICS SENELEC, Ministry of Petroleum and Energy and others. They have also benefited from exchange and sharing sessions with SAIPEM, Wärtsilä and SLB.

INPG trainers also made a second trip to Mauritania to deliver a new training session to staff from the Senegal-Mauritania Joint Tax and Customs Unit. The theme was 'The development of offshore fields- the GTA case'. The aim of the session was to take a closer look at the development of Exploration and Production projects, the issues at stake and the involvement of subcontractors in the various components and sub-components, specifically in the case of GTA.



Update from Nouakchott Interactive Training Centre (NITC)



Over the last six months, in partnership with bp, the NITC have

continued to offer a wide range of workshops and trainings to a host of stakeholders including ministry and local stakeholders. These trainings were delivered by subject matter experts from bp and have been designed to help our stakeholders in Mauritania gain more knowledge and experience of the energy sector. The trainings have covered a variety of topics including bp's values and behaviours, bp's code of conduct, International Association of Oil and Gas Producers – IOGP – lifesaving rules, bp safety leadership principles, ethics and compliance 101, and anti-bribery and corruption. bp also engaged with an industry leading training provider to offer a consultancy service for the NITC to help them with their future plans. Providing access to high quality training and development opportunities for local people to upskill in this industry is one of the key objectives of our local content strategy. Future sessions are currently being planned.



Local content

Social investment update from Mauritania

Improve access and quality of primary health care services in Ndiago

bp and its joint-venture partners, Kosmos and SMH, have invested in social investment programmes that aim to enhance the quality of life in the communities where we operate. Health is one of the main focus areas.

Some villages nearby Ndiago lack access to basic healthcare services due to limited transport options and local medical services. For some, these constraints mean they often don't seek the care needed.

Our health programmes, launched in 2020 aim to promote the health of the Ndiago community by strengthening access to, and quality of, primary healthcare services. Now in 2023, this has been achieved through community awareness-raising on health and sanitation, focusing on basic healthcare and endemic diseases, mother-child healthcare, malnutrition, prevention of STIs, HIV/AIDS, hygiene, and water. Door-to-door awareness campaigns, and the setup of 'medical caravans', travelled around the villages in the form of mobile clinics, thanks to implementing partner SOS PE, improving the accessibility of health care for the population.

The programme has also assisted local healthcare providers in improving their technical capacity by providing training for community workers, and essential equipment to support local health personnel. Four health centres have been rehabilitated, granting pregnant women in the municipality of Ndiago with professional health support for their labour. For occasions such as these, an emergency response service has also been introduced that meets the needs of community members.

Social investment update from Senegal

Improve access and quality of primary health care services in Saint-Louis

Since 2020, bp and its joint-venture partners, Kosmos Energy, PETROSEN, have been investing in the community health programmes in Saint-Louis.



To support access to health care for the Saint-Louis population, activities for a mobile clinic began in October 2020. The execution of the programme coincided with the COVID-19 pandemic, consequently coinciding with restrictions on gatherings of people. First activities were therefore devoted to strengthening advanced strategies for vaccinating children in remote areas of Gandiol and raising awareness of

disease prevention. November 2022 saw the mobile clinic's activities begin holding free

medical consultation campaigns for populations and especially women and children.

The Mobile Clinic approach has strengthened access to care for vulnerable populations, particularly in hard-to-reach areas, and enabled these populations to be consulted by a doctor or specialist for the first time.

The Mobile Clinic is organized in collaboration with several partners including:

- The Medical Region of Saint-Louis
- The Sanitary District of Saint-Louis
- Postal care providers in targeted areas
- Community leaders and traditional chiefs at the local level
- Community-Based Organisations and community relays
- Other partners involved in health at the local level.

This approach complements the health system. It creates a link between the community and healthcare providers to facilitate referral and attendance at health facilities.
